may be used are rarely drawn the author's explorations of Chinese studies illustrate the crucial link between becoming sinophone and developing a sinophone identity learning Chinese and turning Chinese including chapters on relating text to context in learning Chinese the social and political contexts of language learning myths about Chinese characters language reform and nationalism in modern China critical discourse analysis of popular culture ethnicity and identity in language learning this book will be invaluable for all Chinese language students and teachers and those with an interest in Chinese linguistics linguistic anthropology critical discourse analysis and language education Edward McDonald is currently lecturer in Chinese at the University of Auckland and has taught Chinese language music linguistics and semiotics at universities in Australia China and Singapore
